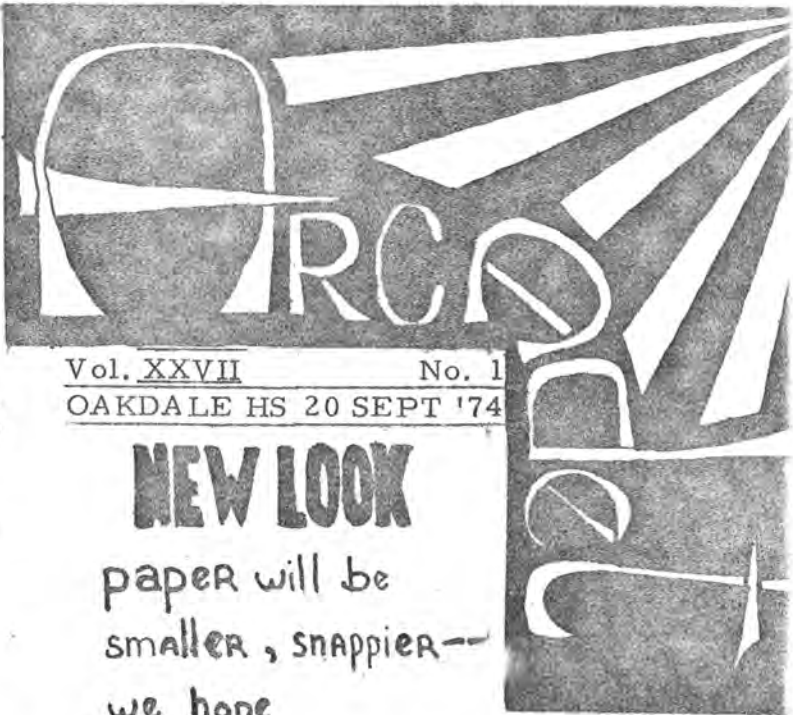

A new vice principal.

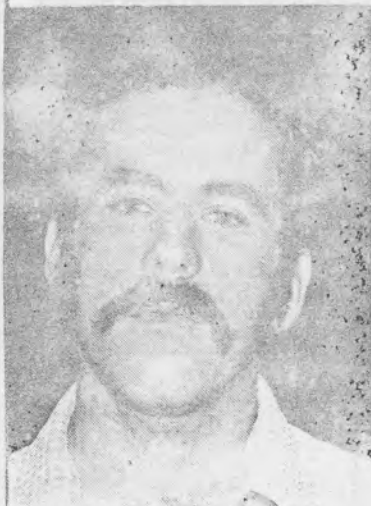
School started last week with 1,285 kids enrolled. That figure rose to 1316 after 10 days. There are 49 teachers -- a

ratio of 1 teacher for each 27 students.

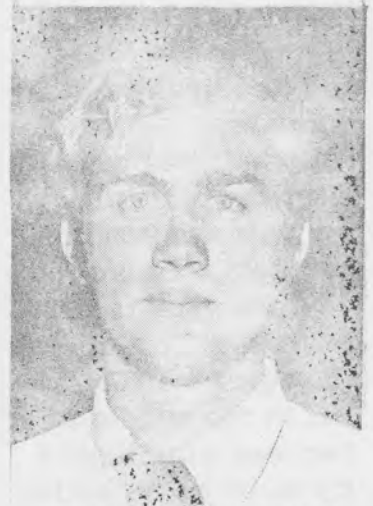
Head Counselor Neil Weichert said this year's walk-around registration was a "success," but he noted some problems with a lack of class selections in the schedule.
